- I have a video explaining how to do practically every problem in the Algebra 2 book (video explanations for other books will soon be available).



How to Get Automatic Assignment Updates

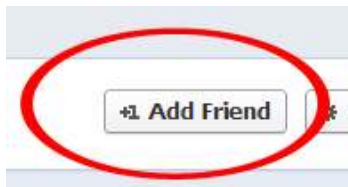


